Day 1 - Arrive Kyoto

Tour begins: Hotel Granvia Kyoto or the Westin Myako Kyoto. A transfer is included from Kansai Int'l Airport or Osaka Int'l Airport to the Hotel Granvia Kyoto or the Westin Myako Kyoto. Dine tonight at your leisure in your hotel.

Day 2 - Temples and traditions in Kyoto

Immerse yourself today in the loveliness of classic Kyoto, city of 2,000 temples and shrines. Like a divine dream the Zen Golden Pavilion, bathed in gold leaf and capped by a golden phoenix, sits in a landscape design meticulously preserved since the 1400s, with a strategically placed pond that hauntingly reflects the shimmering golden temple. Step even further back in time into the Pure Water Temple, circa 780, home of the Jinshu Shrine, dedicated to the deity of love and matchmaking, and the Otowa Waterfall, where you can drink to love, longevity, or success. (Drinking to all three is considered greedy!) After lunch your local guide leads you through the narrow medieval streets of the geisha district Gion, lined with shops, fine restaurants, and teahouses. Spend the rest of the day getting to know Kyoto on your own, hopping on and off the Tauck coach which makes a regular circuit of the city's must-see areas for your convenience. Tonight enjoy a welcome reception, dinner, and geisha performance at the lively Fortune Garden restaurant.

Day 3 - Taiko, Calligraphy, and Tea

This morning get to know traditional Japanese arts with a *taiko* performance (drumming as athletic as it is artful); a tea ceremony; and a calligraphy lesson. Your afternoon and evening are free to explore Kyoto independently. Our coach again makes a circuit of desirable areas so you can get on and off where you like.

Day 4 - Heian shrine & Osaka – Embark L'Austral

Say good-bye to Kyoto today with a visit to the Heian shrine, a powerful symbol of civic pride dedicated to the first and last emperors who ruled when Kyoto was the country's capital. Inside the shrine's massive *torii* gate stands a partial replica of the Heian-period imperial palace. After lunch it's on to Osaka for a walking tour of Dotombori, the energetic neighborhood famous for its dazzling array of neon and mechanical signs. Afterwards board *L'Austral* to begin your cruise through the peaceful Seto Inland Sea, known for its mild climate, and many islands of white sand beaches and green pine woods.

ITINERARY

Day 5 - Art in Naoshima and Kurashiki

Anchor in Uno Ko and board a ferry to the unique little island of Naoshima – it's exclusively devoted to art installations and the work of the world-class architect Tadao Ando. Wander through the Art Houses Project, traditional houses transformed into stand-alone art projects; the Ando Museum; and the Benesse House Museum, designed by Ando to express and explore coexistence among nature, art, and architecture. A walking tour of the historic quarter of Kurashiki reveals an old merchant town, where warehouses, shops, and mills remain virtually unchanged by time and weeping willows line a koi-filled canal. Another Kurashiki treasure, the Ohara Museum of Art, shows you its great collection of Western art, including works by Matisse, Monet, Gauguin, El Greco, and Pollack. Back onboard ship, enjoy your Captain's welcome dinner tonight.

Day 6 - Today's Hiroshima

In your next port, Hiroshima – take in the iconic Miyajima-Itsukushima Shrine that seems to float on water (a photographer's dream); have lunch at a restaurant serving regional fare; and visit the Hiroshima Peace Memorial.

Day 7 - Pearls and squirrels in Uwajima

Today provides a rare chance to spend a morning in a rural Japanese community. Visit a pearl farm, stroll through a market, and check out the Flying Squirrel Temple on a tour led by a Buddhist monk. The squirrels fly only at night!

Day 8 - A volcano, samurai, and shoju

Called the "Naples of Japan" for its location on a bay, Kagoshima lies on the southwestern tip of Japan's southernmost main island, Kyushu. Ferry across the bay to see the volcano Sakurajima up close. A shoju distillery tour reveals all about sake's prime rival; shoju, a bit like port, is the stronger of the two. In nearby Chiran, wander the well-preserved samurai district's stunning Chiran Samurai Gardens, and stop in at the Chiran Peace Museum for Kamikaze Pilots.

Lodging: Aboard L'Austral

Day 9 - A day in Nagasaki

Arrive in Nagasaki for another day of historic sights: the Nagasaki Peace Park, filled with notable monuments and memorials; the Atomic Bomb Museum; and Glover Gardens, an al fresco museum memorializing the Europeans who settled in Nagasaki in the late 19th century.

Meals: B, L, D

Lodging: Aboard L'Austral

Day 10 - Busan, South Korea

Cross the Strait of Korea to Busan, South Korea and visit the Haedong Yonggung Temple, which bears the motto, "At least one of your wishes will be answered here through your heartfelt prayers." Next go to Busan Cinema Center – quite a flamboyant architectural statement – for a private talk on Korea's relations with Japan, China, North Korea, and the USA.

Meals: B, L, D

Lodging: Aboard L'Austral

Day 11 - Matsue's Black Castle

Your yacht arrives in Western Japan's fishing industry center, Sakaiminato, for an excursion to Matsue, known as "the water city" for its river, canals, and setting on two lakes and the Sea of Japan. Weather permitting, take in a great view of the city and beyond from its feudal fortress, the Black Castle, which presides over the city in solemn majesty. After lunch aboard ship choose an optional visit to the Adachi Museum of Art or shuttle into Sakaiminato to pursue your own interests. Tonight say goodbye to captain and crew at the Captain's farewell dinner.

Day 12 - Bullet Train to Tokyo – and Ginza

Disembark in Maizuru and take a scenic drive to Kyoto for the Bullet Train to Tokyo. Walking from your premier Tokyo hotel, your guide introduces the luxury shopping district of Ginza. Enjoy dinner and time to check out the city on your own.

Day 13 - From shrine to sumo in Tokyo

Plunge into an eclectic day in cosmopolitan Tokyo with visits to the Senso-ji Temple – devoted to the Buddhist deity of compassion – and the Meiji Shrine, plus a guided tour of the Edo-Tokyo Museum. Lunch is at a local restaurant before an afternoon of poking around on your own. Finish the day in style with our farewell reception and dinner at Happa-en with traditional music and what's sure to be a highlight of your cruise adventure in Japan, an unforgettable sumo wrestling demonstration that has to be seen to be believed.

Lodging: Mandarin Oriental, Tokyo and Shangri-La, Tokyo

Day 14 - Journey home

Tour ends: Tokyo. Fly home anytime. A transfer is included from the Shangri-La Hotel Tokyo or Mandarin Oriental, Tokyo to Narita International Airport. Allow a minimum of three hours for flight check-in.



L'Austral, a sleek yacht launched in 2011, is small enough to provide a truly intimate cruise experience; her size makes her ideally suited for visiting ports that bigger ships can't reach. *L'Austral* sports 6 decks that include Le Restaurant Gastronomique, the elegant main dining room serving French and international cuisine; the casual Le Grill Restaurant; three lounges offering evening entertainment, bars and access to the open decks; Le Théâtre hosting informative lectures and entertainment; a Fitness and Beauty Corner; a Medical Center; and multiple observation areas. Elevators serve all passenger decks.

Staterooms (ranging in size from 200 to 210 sq. ft.) and suites (ranging in size from 301 to 398 sq. ft.) have ocean views; 95% have private balconies. Staterooms are decorated by French designers, offering individually controlled air conditioning, twin beds converting to a queen-size bed (or one queen-size bed), DVD / CD player, flat-screen TV with satellite channels, electronic safe and minibar.
